Hillary Bor (45:56) broke his own 10-mile American Record enroute to winning his third consecutive title at that distance at the USATF 10-Mile Championship hosted by the Cherry Blossom Run, while Emily Durgin won her first US championship with a 51:26 performance that narrowly missed Keira D'Amato's women's only AR by 3 seconds.

Adam Vadeboncoeur (6:37:53) and Neringa Kaulinaite (7:48:45) won the titles at the USATF 100K Road Championship hosted by Mad City.

Rachel McArthur (4:33) and Vincent Ciattei (3:57) came away with gold medals at the USATF 1 Mile Road Championships hosted by the Grand Blue Mile.

Joe Gray (30:44) and Stephanie Pezzullo (35:35) were the fastest of the day at the USATF Masters 10K Championship hosted by the James Joyce Ramble.

The fourth stop on the USA Running Circuit was our 10 Mile National Road Championship hosted by the Credit Union Cherry Blossom 10 Mile Run on Sunday, April 7th.

The overall winner and setting a new course record of 51:14, was the defending champion, Sarah Chelangat of Uganda.

Chelangat led the race right from the start and never relinquished that position, but Emily Durgin had a great run. Durgin built her lead over the other American women while running with and then passing several international runners. Frisbie and Smith were in pursuit but could not close the gap to Durgin. Smith, our 15K national champion from one month prior, succeeded in pulling away from Frisbie but could not overtake Durgin.

Emily Durgin became a first-time national champion, crossing the line in 51:26. This was only 3 seconds off Keira D'Amato's record from the fall of 2020. Not only did Emily earn the \$10,000 American Champion purse, but also claimed \$3000 for being second overall, as well as \$750 for going sub 52 minutes. As mentioned in our April issue there was indeed some double/triple dipping in prize money. What a day for Emily Durgin!

When was the last time you went to a shopping mall and were able to catch a pole vault competition in progress? Well, if you live near DesMoines, Iowa, it happened on Monday, April 22! In fact, there was some T & F discipline every night of the that week! I love creativity!

On Tuesday, April 23, the Grand Blue Mile hosted our 2024 USATF 1 Mile Road National Championships.

The women went through the halfway point in 2:16. With fewer than 600 meters to go, Rachel McArthur, who was making her road mile debut, surged and clocked a 4:33. I must mention, the race finish line was at Grand Ave. and 13th, not where I had mentioned in last month's newsletter.

With 5 USARC events completed, we currently have Emily Durgin and Rachel Smith tied for first place with 27 points each, Emma Grace Hurley with 22 points, and Annie Frisbie so close behind with 21 points.

The sixth stop on the USA Running Circuit is in downtown Grand Rapids, Michigan on Saturday, May 11th. It is hosted by the Amway River Bank Run which celebrates 47 years of road running. It has been the site of the USA 25K Open Road Championships since 1995 and runs concurrently with the 25K event.

The women will start at 8:19am with the men's start following at 8:30am.

**The Half Marathon Championships being in Indianapolis are contingent upon them receiving a fully executed contract from USATF. Bids are anticipated for the 5 Km Cross Country Championships.

Individuals and teams earn from 5 to 100 points at National Grand Prix events toward end-of-the-year awards; the top 5 events for each individual and each team are counted. The Grand Prix Awards Ceremony is planned for the afternoon of the Club Cross Country Championships on Dec 7, 2024.

<u>USATF 10 Mile Championships — Flint, MI - Aug 24,</u> 2024

USATF's new registration system uses the USATF *CONNECT* membership platform. There is no Status of Entries page. To view the registrants, once you are on the registration page, click on the button titled, 'VIEW PUBLIC ENTRIES'. Once on the new page, you will see a symbol with 3 horizontal lines in the upper left of the screen underneath the Event Name [2024 USATF Masters 10 Km Championships, for example] and above the word, 'Name'. If you click on that, you arrive at the filtering system which allows you to look at all entries by gender and 5-year division or at just the team-affiliated entries by 10-year division.

Once that championship is over on May 19th, applications will be accepted again until August 10th, two weeks before the USATF Masters 10 Mile Championships hosted at the 47th running of the HAP Crim Fitness Center's Crim 10 Miler, in Flint, MI.

Warm greetings to all members of the USATF LDR community. I'm grateful for the opportunity to serve this constituency on the board, and look forward to working alongside Mike and the committees on all the issues at hand this year.

On Tuesday, April 23, the board met for a meeting on zoom. The agenda was short, mostly consisting of a discussion on further clarification of Conflict of Interest issues. While nothing was definitively resolved, I'm hopeful that clarification of these issues at board level will help the hundreds of individuals trying their best to comply at the committee level.

Of note, at the end of the meeting, Max Siegel indicated that the national office has continued to engage with World Athletics to resolve their concerns about the U20 World Athletics Championships and seemed hopeful this might still be a possibility for our athletes. I followed up early this week to see if the hoped for progress had been made, and while not resolved, progress does seem to be continuing.
