

Q: What is the process to become a Race Walk Official / Judge?

A: The first step is to become a USATF Certified Official. To take that first step, contact Scott Phoenix, USATF Oregon Certification Chair. He can guide you through the steps to becoming certified. There are two types of Certified Officials in Race Walking: Race Walk Judge and Race Walk Official. Individuals can elect to become either or both. The first step for both types is to take a basic Race Walk rules review using the USATF Rule Book and Race Walk Handbook. - Race Walk Officials then shadow experienced officials and gain experience in several disciplines (Card Runner, Disqualification Board Operator, Penalty Zone Operator and Recorder) before progressing from an Apprentice to an Association-level official.
- Race Walk Judges shadow experienced judges and gain experience as a Judge, Chief Judge, and Chief Judge Assistant before progressing from an Apprentice to an Association-level Official.
